Legislators to Act on Contract

The Legislature's Subcommittee on Employee Relations is scheduled to meet on Thursday Oct. 29 to consider approval of contracts that cover 15,600 AFSCME members who work for the Executive Branch in Unit 2 (craft and maintenance), Unit 3 (service), Unit 4 (health care), Unit 6 (clerical), Unit 7 (technical), and Unit 25 (radio communications).

The committee's actions will determine when the contracts legally take effect. That will determine when AFSCME members can expect retroactive pay raises.

Corrections Unit 8: The table team will meet with a mediator for the first time on Oct. 26 to try to settle the unresolved contract for the 1,800 Council 5 corrections members in Unit 8.

The Story Behind the First Grape Strike

Before Cesar Chavez, there was Larry Itliong. "The Delano Manongs" tells the story of Itliong and the 1,500 migrant Filipino farm workers who carried out the successful Delano Grape Strike of 1965. The strike – which Chavez's Latino workers refused to break -- paved the way for migrant worker solidarity in California and the later success of the United Farm Workers union.
