A Ground-Breaking Victory

Twenty-two firefighters in the City of Roseville made history this month when they joined Council 5.

They are the first in Minnesota to unionize under a 2012 ruling that allows part-time firefighters to organize if they work an average of at least 14 hours a week.

The Roseville members gained representation when the city recognized that a vast majority of the eligible firefighters signed cards demanding collective bargaining through AFSCME.

Council 5 is accepting nominations to fill an Executive Board vacancy. Nominees must work for a *county* government and be a member in good standing for at least one year.

Attending your district caucus and becoming a convention delegate are the first steps toward re-electing Gov. Mark Dayton and maintaining a House majority that shares our values. That's what we need to achieve in this year's elections.

Raise the Wage to \$9.50!

Next month, the Legislature will return and consider raising the minimum wage. Here's where we stand:

- The House already voted to raise the state's minimum wage to \$9.50 by 2015. The House bill also raises the wage for inflation each year, doesn't penalize tipped workers, and matches up Minnesota law with federal laws on family leave and the 40-hour workweek.
- Gov. Dayton says he supports an increase to \$9.50.
- Unfortunately, Senate legislation raises the wage to only \$7.75 – 50 cents above the outdated federal rate.
 Here's what you can do:

Contact state senators now. Tell them: Make hard work pay – raise the wage to \$9.50 by 2015. To find your senator, call 651-296-0504.

Locals Ratify Contracts

Hermantown School District. Members of this unit in Local 66 ratified a two-year contract through June 30, 2015. Upon school board approval, the contract provides a 1.5 percent raise retroactive to Jan. 1, and another 1.5 percent raise in 2015. The contract also increases starting salaries by eliminating the first step; increases the employer's health-insurance contribution each year; and increases the meal allowance.

Safe Haven Shelter, Duluth. Members of this unit in Local 3558 ratified a two-year contract through Sept. 30, 2015. The contract includes a 2.5 percent pay raise retroactive to Oct. 1, 2013, and another 2.5 percent raise effective Oct. 1, 2014. It eliminates a provision that allowed the employer to terminate the retirement annuity plan, adds a provision that clarifies health insurance eligibility, and creates a labormanagement committee.

City of South St. Paul. Members of Local 2535 ratified a two-year contract for 2014 and 2015. It includes a 2.5 percent pay raise retroactive to Jan. 1, another 2.5 percent pay raise in January 2015, additional "market adjustment" raises of 50 cents an hour this year for about half the bargaining unit, and four classification upgrades worth about \$1,600 a year.

Scholarship Deadline is Jan. 31

Jan. 31 is the deadline to apply for a Union Plus scholarship, which is part of AFSCME Advantage.

Active and retired members in good standing for at least one year, their spouses, and their dependent children all are eligible. The scholarships, which range from \$500 to \$4,000, can be used for graduate or undergraduate study at colleges, universities, and trade or technical schools in the U.S.
