Expect an Action-Packed Convention

AFSCME Strong training for every delegate, a rally in support of union jobs in Duluth, and a speech by Gov. Mark Dayton are highlights of Council 5's annual convention this week.

The convention, "Stronger Together," runs Thursday Oct. 1 until Saturday Oct. 3 at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center. Key events:

- A Safe Staffing strategy session occurs Wednesday Sept. 30 at the Holiday Inn, from 11 a.m.-1 p.m. in the Lake Michigan/Huron Room.
- New delegate **orientation** is Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. at the Holiday Inn.
- Workshops run Thursday morning at the DECC.
- The convention officially opens Thursday at 1:45 p.m. AFSCME Strong training and the rally happen Friday; Gov. Dayton speaks to delegates Saturday. Business concludes by noon Saturday.

Legislators to Act on Contract

The Legislature's Subcommittee on Employee Relations is scheduled to meet on Thursday Oct. 22 to consider approval of contracts that cover 15,600 AFSCME members who work for the Executive Branch in Unit 2 (craft and maintenance), Unit 3 (service), Unit 4 (health care), Unit 6 (clerical), Unit 7 (technical), and Unit 25 (radio communications).

The committee's actions will determine when the contracts legally take effect. That will determine when AFSCME members can expect retroactive pay raises.

Corrections Unit 8: The table team will meet with a mediator for the first time on Oct. 26 to try to settle the unresolved contract for the 1,800 Council 5 corrections members in Unit 8.
