Lawmakers, Don't Blow the Surplus

Minnesota's state budget surplus is now forecast at \$900 million, down from \$1.2 billion last December. We are calling on the Legislature to keep investing in economic security for hardworking Minnesota families.

"The forecast shows that Minnesota's budget is back in the black, but there's more work to be done," cautions executive director Eliot Seide. "With an uncertain economy, legislators must resist the urge to blow the surplus on huge tax breaks for billionaires and giant corporations headquartered in the metro area."

AFSCME Against Private Prisons

A coalition of Minnesota-based community, faith, labor and civil rights organizations is opposing the state's proposed lease of a long-shuttered Appleton prison owned by the Corrections Corporation of America (CCA).

The coalition, which includes AFSCME Council 5, seeks to raise awareness about CCA's terrible record of cutting corners — endangering prisoners and corrections workers — to make money. That record's summarized in a new issue brief by In the Public Interest.

"Giving Minnesota taxpayer dollars to CCA — even if it's a lease — would give a foothold in our criminal justice system to a company that has shown itself to be a bad actor by repeatedly failing to follow basic regulations and standards," says Council 5 executive director Eliot Seide.
