March with Janitors, Security Guards

- Janitors and private security guards represented by SEIU Local 26 invite AFSCME members to join them Jan. 24 for a solidarity march in downtown Minneapolis. The march begins at 11 a.m. at the Hennepin County Government Center.
- The workers clean and protect the buildings of the state's richest corporations. But 5,000 of these workers are fighting for new contracts and against proposals that turn hundreds of full-time, living-wage jobs into part-time jobs with lower pay and benefits.

- With new DFL majorities in the Legislature, and a DFL governor, this is Minnesota's Moment. It's a chance to fix the budget without gimmicks, to raise revenue fairly, and to build an economy that gives everyone a chance to get ahead.

ALEC's Minions Can't Hide for Long

Sen. Scott Dibble has introduced legislation (SF26) that defines groups such as ALEC – the American Legislative Exchange Council – as lobbyists and requires them to disclose their members and funders.

New Dues Take Effect Jan. 1

Because of formulas in the AFSCME International constitution, minimum dues for full-time members in many locals increased by 30 cents a month on Jan. 1.

- Of the increase, 10 cents goes to the International, 15 cents goes to Council 5, and 5 cents stays with the local. Dues for part-time members increased by 15 cents a month.
- This increase in minimum dues does not apply to some locals, including those that raised dues in 2012 or that have a "percentage" or "progressive" dues structure.
